Re: Courses Designated as Satisfying Graduation Requirements

In compliance with ABA Standard 303 (Curriculum), a student may **not** use one course to satisfy more than one Standard 303(a) requirement.

A particular Yale Law School course may be listed as qualified to meet the following requirements: professional responsibility; experiential; and a Substantial Paper or Supervised Analytic Writing paper. An individual student, however, may use that course to satisfy only one of those requirements.

A student enrolled in a course with multiple designations must notify the instructor and the registrar which requirement they intend to satisfy by successfully completing the course.

For experiential courses, the fieldwork and classroom component (seminar) count towards only one requirement per semester. The fieldwork and classroom components of a clinical course must be taken in the same semester to count towards the experiential unit graduation requirement.

It is the student's responsibility to review the accuracy of their degree audit and ensure a course is not counting towards more than one requirement. Questions should be directed to registrar.law@yale.edu.
